

Annual report on UK local authority food law enforcement

1 April 2013 to 31 March 2014

Data summary – England



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1. INTRODUCTION


1.1 This report, which covers the period 1 April 2013 to 31 March 2014, provides a summary of local authority (LA) food law enforcement activity within food businesses in England and on the Food Standards Agency's (FSA) audit of English LAs. 2. ESTABLISHMENT PROFILES

2.1 As at 31 March 2014, a total of 508,630 food establishments were registered with LAs in England, an increase of 2.3% on 2012/13 (497,090).


2.2 A comparison of establishment types over the past three years indicates a gradual increase in numbers across all premises types with the exception of primary producers.



A comparison of the split of risk ratings in food establishments indicates a decrease of 1.7% in premises rated A to C (from 210,742 in 2012/13 to 207,107 in 2013/14) and an increase of 6.1% in premises rated D and E (from 247,422 in 2012/13 to 262,520 in 2013/14).

Establishments Not Yet Rated²

2.4 In England, 5.3% of registered food establishments were not yet rated (NYR) for food hygiene risk as at 31 March 2014 (27,007 out of 508,630). This is an improvement on the 2012/13 figure of 5.7% (28,128 out of 497,090).

2.5 There has been an increase in the number of LAs in England reporting levels of NYR establishments below 5% (63.6% of LAs, compared with 58.6% in 2012/13).


3 LOCAL AUTHORITY INTERVENTIONS

Food hygiene interventions


3.1 During 2013/14, 319,072 food hygiene interventions were carried out in England, a 1.6% decrease on the reported number in 2012/13 (324,394).

Inspections and audits remain the most frequent food hygiene intervention type (67.4%, compared with 66.7% in 2012/13). The number of advice and education visits decreased by 13.8% (from 19,231 in 2012/13 to 16,584 in 2013/14). The levels for all other food hygiene intervention types were within 5% of those reported in 2012/13,



3.3 The trend for LAs to target higher risk establishments (Category A to C) for food hygiene intervention, at the expense of due interventions at lower risk establishments has continued.




Food standards interventions

3.4 During 2013/14, 78,461 food standards interventions were carried out in England, a 3.2% increase on the reported number in 2012/13 (76,020), reversing the decline in previous years.


Figure 3.4: Food standards interventions carried out in England 2013/14

3.5 As in previous years, inspections and audit were the most prevalent food standards intervention type carried out in 2013/14, with the same percentage rate as 2012/13. There was an increase in the percentage of verifications and surveillance; sampling visits and information / intelligence gathering

interventions compared with 2012/13. Advice and education interventions decreased by 31.2% in the same period.



3.6 LAs have continued to target higher risk establishments (Category A) for food standards interventions across much of the UK. The figures for England were lower than the UK average.




4 ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS


Food hygiene enforcement actions

4.1 In 2013/14, 136,668 food hygiene enforcement actions were reported in England, 130,764 written warnings and 5,904 other 'official' enforcement actions.

4.2 This is an increase of 1.7% on 2012/13 (134,447), although numbers of some types of enforcement action have decreased.






Food standards enforcement actions

4.3 In total food standards enforcement actions were reported in England in 2013/14, 8,932 written warnings and 215 other 'official' enforcement actions.


4.4 This is an increase of 18.5% on 2012/13 (9,147).



5 OFFICIAL FOOD SAMPLES


5.1 A total of 47,207 official food samples were taken in England in 2013/14, a decrease of 1.7% from 2012/13, compared with a UK wide increase of 3.0%.


6 CONSUMER COMPLAINTS ABOUT FOOD AND FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS

6.1 LAs in England dealt with a total of 59,729 consumer complaints about food and food establishments during 2013/14, an increase of 2.7% (from 58,169) on 2012/13 data.




7 FULL TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) PROFESSIONAL LA STAFF

7.1 English LAs reported a total of 1,735 FTE professional LA staff as being in post at 31 March 2014. This represents an overall 4.7% decrease on 2012/13 figures (1,820), compared with a 3.2% reduction across the whole of the UK. A comparison between types of posts shows that there has been a much greater reduction in food standards professional posts (8.5%), with a 1.1% reduction in food hygiene professional posts.



8 FOOD HYGIENE COMPLIANCE

8.1 The level of Broad Compliance in England as at 31 March 2014 was 92.1% of rated establishments (87.1% of all establishments), compared with a 91.7% level across the UK. This is an increase on the 2012/13 level in England of 91.2% of rated establishments (86.4% of all establishments).
