

Annual report on UK local authority food law enforcement

1 April 2013 to 31 March 2014

Data summary – Scotland



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1. INTRODUCTION


1.1 This report, which covers the period 1 April 2013 to 31 March 2014, provides a summary of local authority (LA) food law enforcement activity within food businesses in Scotland and on the Food Standards Agency's (FSA) audit of Scottish LAs. 2. ESTABLISHMENT PROFILES


2.1 As at 31 March 2014 a total of 59,038 food establishments were registered with LAs in Scotland, an increase of 2.9% on 2012/13 (57,351).

2.2 A comparison of establishment types over the past three years indicates a slight reduction in the number of registered primary producers and distributors / transporters; whilst the number of registered premises for all other establishment types have risen year on year.



2.3 A comparison of the split between risk ratings in food establishments indicates a reduction of 0.8% in premises rated A to C (from 29,282 in 2012/13 to 29,524 in 2013/14) and an increase of 4.3% in premises rated D and E (from 22,528 in 2012/13 to 23,503 in 2013/14).



Establishments Not Yet Rated 1

2.4 In Scotland, 9.2% of registered food establishments were not yet rated (NYR) for food hygiene risk as at 31 March 2013 (5,419 out of 59,088).

2.5 This is an increase on the 2012/13 figure of 8.8% (5,066 out of 57,351) for Scotland and is not consistent with the downward trend in NYR establishments seen elsewhere in the UK.


3 LOCAL AUTHORITY INTERVENTIONS

Food hygiene interventions

3.1 During 2013/14, 41,635 food hygiene interventions were carried out in Scotland, a 2.5% decrease on the reported number in 2012/13 (43,879).


Figure 3.1: Food hygiene interventions carried out in Scotland 2013/14

3.2 Inspections and audits remain the most frequent food hygiene intervention type, although the percentage rate has decreased this year (57.0%, compared with 61.4% in 2012/13). The levels of verification and surveillance; sampling visits; and information/intelligence gathering have each seen a slight increase.



3.3 The trend for LAs to target higher risk establishments (Category A to C) for food hygiene intervention, at the expense of due interventions at lower risk

establishments has continued, although the figures for Category C in Scotland were lower than elsewhere in the UK.




Food standards interventions

3.4 During 2013/14, 17,414 food standards interventions were carried out in Scotland, a 10% decrease on the reported number in 2012/13 (19,345). In comparison, the UK average has increased by 2.8% in the same period.


Figure 3.4: Food standards interventions carried out in Scotland 2013/14

3.5 As in previous years, food standards inspections and audits were the most prevalent food standards intervention type in 2013/14, despite a decrease of 12.3% on 2012/13 data. The level of information/intelligence gathering activity was lower than 2012/13 (906 compared with 1,235 last year) but still

remains higher than that seen in previous years. The number of sampling visits is continuing to rise year on year.



3.6 The levels of food standards due interventions achieved in Scotland have decreased slightly on 2012/13 levels, but still remain higher than the UK average.




4 ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

Food hygiene enforcement actions

4.1 In 2013/14, 13,569 food hygiene enforcement actions were reported in Scotland, 12,896 written warnings and 673 other 'official' enforcement actions.


Figure 4.1: Number of establishments subject to food hygiene enforcement actions in Scotland 2013/14

4.2 This is a decrease of 14.1% on 2012/13 (15,789), although numbers of some types of enforcement action have increased.


4.3 In total 2,235 food standards enforcement actions were reported in Scotland in 2013/14, 2,231 written warnings and 4 seizure, detention and surrender of food.

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

5 OFFICIAL FOOD SAMPLES


5.1 A total of 11,313 official food samples were taken in Scotland in 2013/14, an increase of 17.1% from 2012/13, compared with a UK wide increase of 3.0%.


6 CONSUMER COMPLAINTS ABOUT FOOD AND FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS

6.1 Scottish LAs dealt with a total of consumer complaints about food and food establishments during 2013/14, an increase of 1.5% (from 5,256) on 2012/13. There was an increase of 4.8% in food safety complaints in Scotland, compared with an over decrease of 0.2% across the UK as a whole.




7 FULL TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) PROFESSIONAL LA STAFF

7.1 Scottish LAs reported a total of 356 FTE professional LA staff was reported as being in post at 31 March 2014. This represents a 0.8% decrease on 2012/13 figures (359).



8 FOOD HYGIENE COMPLIANCE

8.1 The level of Broad Compliance in Scotland as at 31 March 2014 was 87.5% of rated establishments (79.3% of all establishments), compared with a 91.7% level across the UK. This is an increase on the 2012/13 level in Scotland of 87.3% of rated establishments (79.8% of all establishments).
